Student Evaluation Plan

1. ACADEMIC GRADING AND TEST PLAN:

a. **Written Test Evaluation Standards:** Written tests are scored GO or NO-GO. A numerical score is used to determine student status (70% and above GO; 69% and below NO-GO). Students receiving a NO-GO on their first test attempt receive remedial training and another opportunity to test. Students failing to meet minimum standards on second attempt are reassigned to a junior class. After additional training, student receives a third and final test attempt. Active Army students failing to meet minimum standards after third attempt are processed for MOS reclassification or discharged from the Armed Forces. USAR/ARNG students, who fail to meet minimum standards after third attempt, are recalled to Home Station for disposition.

88M11A11 - 1.5	Wheeled Vehicle General Knowledge Test Module A: Motor Transport Skills and Knowledge	70% GO/NO-GO

Closed-book test consisting of 50 multiple-choice questions with four alternative answers. Two test versions are administered, but are equal in measurement and difficulty. To receive a GO, students must correctly answer at least 35 out of 50 questions (70%) within 60-minutes. Students must receive a GO before being issued a learner's permit and advancing to 5 ton tactical vehicle operations training.

88M11B12 - 1.5	Written Test on 5 Ton Vehicles Module B: 5 Ton Tactical Vehicle Operations	70% GO/NO-GO

Closed-book test consisting of 50 multiple-choice questions, each with four alternative answers. To receive a GO, students must correctly answer at least 35 out of 50 questions (70%) within 60-minutes. Students receiving a GO will proceed to 14 ton M915 tractor-semitrailer combination operations training.

b. **Hands-On Performance Test Evaluation Standards:** Hands-on performance tests are scored GO or NO-GO. All tasks have minimum standards determining student status. Students receiving NO-GO on first test attempt receive remedial training and another opportunity to test. Students failing to meet minimum standards on second attempt are reassigned to a junior class. After additional training, student receives a third and final test attempt. Active Army students failing to meet minimum standards after the third attempt are processed for MOS reclassification or may be discharged from the Armed Forces. USAR/ARNG students, who fail to meet minimum standards after the third attempt, are recalled to Home Station for disposition.

Hands-on performance test measuring student ability to correctly perform preventive maintenance checks and services IAW AR 600-55, The Army Driver and Operator Standardization Program (Selection, Training, Testing, and Licensing), utilizing appropriate -10 manual and required Basic Issue Items (BII), while complying with all notes, cautions, and instructions. To receive a GO, students must correctly identify a minimum of seven out of ten deficiencies placed on specially prepared FMTV-series vehicles and record on DA Form 5988E, Equipment Maintenance and Inspection Worksheet. Score is documented on DA Form 6125-R, Road Test Score Sheet.

88M11B11 - 4.0	Performance Test Basic Control of Vehicle Module B: 5 Ton Tactical Vehicle Operations	GO/NO-GO

Hands-on performance test measuring basic control maneuvers while operating a 5 ton tactical vehicle. To receive a GO, students must meet or exceed minimum standards for each maneuver IAW AR 600-55. Score is documented on DA Form 6125-R.

- Drive forward through a 100 foot alley and stop as close as possible to stop line at end of alley. Straight line back through 100 foot alley with no more than three (3) encroachments or pull-ups.
- Execute a right turn. Rear wheels must be within 18 inches of cone without hitting cone or going over boundaries.
- Back into an alley and stop with rear bumper between stop line and clearance line with no more than two (2) encroachments or pull-ups.

88M11C06 – 7.5	Performance Test on the M915 Module C: M915 Tractor-Semitrailer Operations	GO/NO-GO

Comprehensive hands-on test employing use of an M915A4 tractor, M872 semi-trailer, appropriate -10 manuals, DA Form 5987E, Motor Equipment Dispatch, and DA Form 5988E, throughout evaluation. To receive a GO, students must satisfactorily complete each event IAW AR 600-55. Score is documented on DA Form 6125-R.

- Perform couple/uncouple procedures IAW -10 manual. Students have 20 minutes to complete exercise.
- Alley dock (45-degree angle). Sight-side back vehicle into alley; stop when rear of trailer is between two cones or lines at end. Students have 10-minutes to complete exercise.
- Straight-line back vehicle 100-feet between two rows of cones or lines without touching or crossing over exercise boundaries. Stop vehicle when front bumper is between the two cones or lines at end. Students have 10-minutes to complete exercise).
- Complete road test scoring 80 points or more.

88M11D04 – 16.0	Performance Test on LHS/HEMTT Module D: HEMTT/LHS Operations	GO/NO-GO

Comprehensive hands-on test employing use of an M1120 LHS, M1076 trailer, M1077 Flatrack, appropriate -10 manuals, DA Forms 5987E and 5988E throughout evaluation. To receive a GO, students must satisfactorily complete each event IAW AR 600-55. Score is documented on DA Form 6125-R.

- Conduct load and unload operations in automatic mode.
- Successfully transfer Flatrack onto and from M1076 PLS trailer. Students have 10 minutes to complete exercise.
- Complete road test scoring 80 points or more.

2. **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:** To ensure students have access to this evaluation plan, it will be posted in all barracks, orderly rooms and training areas operated by this battalion. In addition, each student will be briefed on the following information during unit and course in processing:

- a. Battalion, company, course SOP's (i.e., class hours, uniform requirements, standards of conduct, etc.).
- b. Academic procedures, to include academic chain of command and instructor responsibilities.

- c. Apportionment of scoring points within the Evaluation Plan, particularly distribution of examination scoring points per graded examination, and retesting policy.
 - d. Mandatory counseling for academic performance, to include academic standing.
 - e. Disposition of course materials.
 - f. Standards and requirements for satisfactory performance and graduation.
 - g. Course graduation specifics and procedures, to include date and time of ceremonies.
3. **COUNSELING:** Students will be counseled by instructors and/or instructor's supervisors whenever they fail to achieve a GO in any evaluated event, or when academic average approaches or falls below 70%. Students in borderline or failing status are given remedial training.
4. **MINIMUM ACADEMIC STANDARDS:** Students must -
- a. Attend 70% of scheduled instructional periods.
 - b. Achieve a final grade average of not less than 70%.
 - c. Receive a GO on all end-of-module tests for all critical tasks taught in the 551-88M10 dL Program of Instruction.

5. **PHYSICAL READINESS AND WEIGHT CONTROL:**

- a. IAW AR 350-1, Para 3-9d, Soldiers attending reclassification courses have completed IET and do not need to repeat basic Soldier training and have no APFT requirement.
- b. Students will also comply with weight and body composition standards outlined in AR 600-9, The Army Weight Control Program.
